Welcome and thank you for visiting the Itasca Country Club! We are so glad to have you here! Here is information that our golfers typically find most helpful:

- **Golf Bag** - The golf bag drop off area is adjacent to the clubhouse. Please ring the bell to notify the bag room staff of your arrival and our staff will be up soon to retrieve your golf bag.
 - **Locker Rooms** - The men's locker room entrance is marked and located at the west side of the clubhouse. Ladies locker room entrance is located on the north side of building or through the Fox & Turtle entrance.
 - **Golf Course Attire** - Only conventional and appropriate golf attire may be worn on the golf course and the practice range. Shorts are permitted but should not rise more than four inches above the knee. Metal spikes are not permitted. Jeans are not permitted on the golf course.
 - **Ladies Golf Course Attire** - If Ladies choose to wear a blouse with no collar it must have sleeves if it has no sleeves it must have a collar.
 - **Cell Phone Use** - Please be respectful of our members and others guests if you must utilize your cell phone while in and around the Club and golf course.
 - **Practice Facilities** - The driving range, practice green and putting greens are available for your use.
 - **Expected Pace of Play** - Rapid play is fundamental to golf at Itasca Country Club. In order to advance this approach, the following standards of playing pace have been established: 9 holes – 1.55 hours/18 holes – 3.50 hours
 - **The 3-Minute Search** - A ball should be declared lost after 3 minutes.
 - **The Open-Hole Rule** - Please keep pace with the group ahead of your match. If there is an open hole in front of you, please ask a faster match behind you to play through.
 - **Play "Ready Golf"** - Always be ready to play your next shot, even when closer to the hole than other players.
 - **Care of the Course** - Each member and guest has the responsibility of taking care of the course. Please help with the following:
 - Repair ball marks on the greens
 - Replace divots
 - Rake bunkers and place rakes IN bunkers
 - Do not walk up the face of bunkers, rather enter from low side
 - Keep the golf carts on paths around green and tees, and avoid newly sodded, seeded or roped off areas
 - Deposit smoking materials and other litter in available containers and never on the course
